This is the first time for the NW Area rally to be held in Longview. Come to gain new ideas, tips on motorhome maintenance, and explore the lower Columbia region.



MEMBERSHIP SURVEY PROVIDES INSIGHTS



In December 2016 a survey of the NWTFC membership was conducted. The primary purpose of this survey was to gauge the NWTFC membership's desire to be involved in FMCA activities. Since NWTFC is an FMCA chapter and is involved in the NW Area of FMCA, it was also important to gauge the interest or understanding of that relationship. The main annual event of the FMCA NW Area is an annual rally that seeks to bring together the 34 NW FMCA. NWTFC's involvement in the annual NW Area rally is one of the chapter's annual activities; therefore it was important to gauge the interest/commitment of the NWTFC membership to this event.

There were 33 responses to the survey. The responses represent 39.3% of the membership (33/84). The NWTFC leadership is grateful for all who participated, and it is the best gauge of interest and commitment that we have ever gathered.

FMCA involvement

There is a strong commitment to FMCA as a national organization representing motorhome owners among NWTFC members. NWTFC members appreciate the services and benefits of FMCA membership (66.8%). The fact that FMCA is a representative organization with a structure that enables members to influence the direction of FMCA was appreciated by the membership (63.6%)). Members appreciate that FMCA is a national organization that can speak for motorhome owners (72.7%).

Many NWTFC members would not have joined FMCA except for the fact that NWTFC is an FMCA chapter and FMCA membership was required before joining NWTFC (33.3%). However, most of these members also came to appreciate the role and benefits associated with FMCA membership. A very small minority of the membership saw no benefit to being associated with FMCA.

The most popular FMCA benefits were: 1) FMCA magazine, 2) Michelin Advantage tire discount program, 3) FMCAassist – medical emergency & travel assist program, 4) national conventions, and 5) campground discounts.

FMCA NW Area Interest/Involvement

NWTFC is a member of the Northwest Area of FMCA. The main event of FMCA NW is an annual areawide rally each June. The area rally brings together approximately 500 motorhomes and provides seminars, speakers, vendors, and entertainment for the benefit of motorhome owners. Chapters and members provide the planning and staffing for this event.

There is a strong appreciation for NWTFC's involvement in the FMCA NW Area. NWTFC has participated in the NW Area rally for many years and there is support for continuing to participate. There are a significant number of members who have not volunteered at an area rally, but are willing to consider volunteering.

The survey indicated that some members will volunteer for such involvement while others will not for a variety of reasons. Some members do not desire to be involved in large gatherings, preferring activities of the local chapter only. We appreciate all members and want everyone to feel welcome in the club. We are grateful for those who choose to volunteer for the area rally, and we also appreciate those who serve as officers, committee chairs, and wagon masters for NWTFC rallies.

To stimulate more participation in the NW Area rallies, several suggestions were made:

- Limit volunteer involvement to a reasonable amount of time.
- Encourage chapter activity during the area rally.
- NWTFC members camp together and encourage social times during the area rally. NWTFC can be a group within the larger rally "crowd."
- Area rallies be improved to have better entertainment and more and different workshops. More emphasis on programming so that it is more enticing to see what is new at the next area rally.

Several ideas for improving the NW area rallies have been passed on to the NW area leadership.

The survey indicated it is likely there will be sufficient volunteers to staff the store at the NW Area rallies in Longview and Coos Bay. The FMCA national convention will be at Redmond in 2020. There is significantly more interest in attending the national convention in Redmond. 20 indicated a definite or willingness to consider attending the national convention in 2020.

The NWTFC leadership appreciates everyone's participation in the survey. Your responses and suggestions will help us make improvements and function more effectively. Improvements Noted

Procedures

Modified rally guidelines adopted in 2016 allow for more rally masters per rally and extended stay for remote locations. We approved advance funding for rallies that require a heavy down payment far in advance of rally receipts. This includes situations where a state park or other entity may require an advance payment in order to reserve campsites for a group.

FMCA

The national director, Al Zimmerman, conducted a broad survey on FMCA participation and member preferences. That was completed in January. A summary of the results in included in the January 2017 Trek Travels newsletter and the website.

Website

Both the NWTFC websites and Trek Tracks website were structurally deficient as platforms adopted many years ago are no longer viable or supported. Our Webmaster created a plan in 2015 to migrate to new lands and the plan was

implemented in the 4th quarter. Our club (with executive board approval) took on the responsibility of receiving, accounting and disbursing funds in support of Trek Tracks during this complicated conversion process. Trek Tracks is a popular blog that we have hosted for many years, but do not manage. This conversion process is almost done thanks to the generosity of its members and the vision its administrators and volunteers. We are glad we could help.

Treasury

A "lot of work" goes on in the back office of the NWTFC to keep the club's programs rolling along. Our "Spreadsheet Guru" is NWTFC'S treasurer, Sue Bjornson, and she has somehow managed to grow our club assets by over 25% when compared to the last two-year average of cash available for operations. We have also developed a new format for our Statement of Financial Condition. You can read all about our P&L in her annual treasure's report. Thanks, Sue

A fond farewell was given to officers Dean Bjornson and Ken Anderson. New officers were elected in November. They are vice president – Paula Shull, alternate national director - Mike Ashbridge – Sue Bjornson retained her position as Treasurer for a 2nd term. Thanks to all.

In 2017 three more Officers will rotate out: president, FMCA national director, and secretary. Please think about serving as an officer when Paula Shull comes calling.

I look forward to seeing all of you at one or more of our rallies and safe travels in 2017.

This past year has been exciting. NWTFC has 30 new members, but has lost 12 members. Our membership now stands at 84. Further, our web site has gone through a complete rebuild (thank you Mary Carlson) which now even recognizes those of us that have moved to SOME OTHER BRAND. Our Webmaster has also contributed to the rebuild of Trek Tracks, which we as an organization continue to support.

Our newsletter continues on a quarterly basis and has gotten many compliments across the various chapters, thank you Al Zimmerman.

Further growth and excitement continues, the RV Industry is growing supported by low interest rates, low fuel costs and an expected future employment market (Boeing Forecast).

Webmaster - Mary Carlson

So far 46 members have set up a member account on the new NWTFC website. If you haven't, please do so. I will also be sending out instructions once the site is finalized.

Some of the features of the new NWTFC website are:

- A secure Member's Only Section, only viewable to members who are logged in. It includes:
 - a. Administrative Information, i.e., Bylaws, Minutes, etc.

- A Member Directory. Logged in members can view member's information. Each member can also view and edit their profile. Members can even upload pictures and include links to personal websites, blogs, Linked-In pages, etc.
- Connect page, where members can post travel plans, places they will be, opportunities to meet up, etc.
- Club Newsletters and a brochure that members can print out to give to prospective members.
- A list of current and future rallies.
- An index of past rallies.
- A history of the Trek and brochures for each Trek year.
- The Isuzu InfoLetters page. (This is another membership group) that we partner with. Bret Medbury is the current editor of the InfoLetter. He submits it to me and I upload it to our website. There are currently 39 issues online and although focused on the Isuzu, there is information there that could apply to any year.

Because NWTFC did not have to pay an advanced campground reservation fee, the chapter's financial condition is actually improved over 2015 by almost \$1,000.

Port Townsend, WA Rally – August 11 – 14 ◊ 24 coaches. NWTFC members seem to swarm to this rally. Downtown is a short walk from Pt. Townsend Marina RV Park so attendees were on their own for exploration. The weather was perfect and the view over the water to the Cascades and Mt. Baker couldn't be beat. Several honorary members rented a motel and some members dropped in for the potluck dinner. Wagon masters were Mary Burchett and Ron Mahugh.

Harvest Moon Rally at Wallowa Lake State Park – September 13 17 ♦ 12 coaches. A tour of the Valley Bronze Foundry in nearby Joseph, OR included all facets of the bronze process. The foundry produced all the extensive bronze work that is part of the WWII Memorial in Washington,

DC. Some rode the rails on human-powered cars on the Joseph Branch rail line – 12 mile round trip to Enterprise (1/2 downhill and ½ uphill on the return)! Tram trip to the top of Mt. Howard provided spectacular scenic views. Wagon masters were Paula and Bill Shull, Nancy and Dick Harris.

National Director Al Zimmerman

FMCA national items from area meetings and national convention

- FMCA executive director resigned and Chris Smith is the new executive director/CFO.
- FMCA store is now being outsourced and this should lead to better inventory for sale at area rallies
- FMCA is acquiring new members the challenge is retaining members. A call center is being used to follow-up of membership renewals. For 2016 FMCA nationally had an increase in membership numbers for the first time in several years.
- FMCAssist has been a positive factor in acquiring new members. New FMCA membership card has FMCAssist info on the back of the card. FMCAssist claims are exceeding anticipated figures resulting in losses. Premiums will be increasing to cover these losses. At the present time, FMCAssist premiums are being paid from investment earnings. There were 73 claims last year.
- In an effort to amplify FMCA's membership marketing effort and utilize social media venues, FMCA invested \$250,000 from investment reserves in RVillage, an online social network website. In return, the FMCA logo is displayed

on the RVillage website as a means of encouraging the recruitment of new members.

- A dues increase of \$10 per year was implemented effective October 2016.
- In an effort to reach younger people and new groups, it was proposed that FMCA alter its Articles of Incorporation so that FMCA as an organization is not strictly limited to motorhome owners. A vote by the FMCA membership was conducted through the FMCA magazine with ballots due by December 31. The result may be a division or separate company associated with FMCA that may include towable RV owners.

SHOP TOOLS AND THE REAL REASONS THEY WERE MADE



Skill saw – a portable cutting tools used to make boards short.

Belt sander – an electric sanding tool commonly used to convert minor touch-up jobs into major refinishing jobs.

Drill press – a tall upright machine useful for suddenly snatching flat metal bar stock out of your hands so that it smacks you in the chest and flings your beer across the room, denting the freshly-painted project which you had carefully set in the corner where nothing could get to it.

Channel locks – used to round off bolt heads. Sometimes used in the creation of blood blisters.

Hacksaw – One of a family of cutting tools built on the Ouija board principle. It transforms human energy into a crooked, unpredictable motion; and the more you attempt to influence its course, the more dismal your future becomes.

Table saw – a large stationary power tool commonly used to launch wood projectiles for testing wall integrity. Very effective for digit removal.

Phillips screwdriver – normally used to stab the vacuum seals under lids or for opening old-style paper and tin oil cans and splashing oil on your shirt, but can also be used, as the name implies, to strip out Phillips screw heads.

Straight screwdriver – a tool for opening paint cans. Sometimes used to convert common slotted screws into non-removable screws and butchering your palms.

Hammer – originally employed as a weapon of war, the hammer nowadays is used as a kind of diving rod to locate the most expensive parts adjacent to the object you are trying to hit. Also - very effective at fingernail removal.

SOB tool – any handy tool that you grab and throw across the garage while yelling "son of a b___h" at the top of your lungs. It is also, most often, the next tool that you will need.
